ut with the old and in with the new as many people say. In the case of college campuses, this means graduates and freshmen!

A new class of excited freshmen will come to Rend Lake College in the fall. With that excitement, there may be a bit of fear or feelings of nervousness. The Clocktower Chronicle reached out to some high school students who will be freshmen at RLC next term. It also sought the advice of some current students.

"I am a bit nervous," one high school student admitted. "What if I can't find my classes? ... At my high school, we have one building and two hallways."

This is a common cause of worry. A sophomore business major at RLC said that although the campus does have more of a university layout — there are six buildings where most of the classes are held and an additional eight — it didn't take him anytime to learn where his classes were and how to get there.

"There are maps around campus if you don't want to ask," he said. "And everyone of the employees I've met are very nice and totally willing to help."

Building layouts can also be found on a smartphone, using Google Maps.

Some incoming freshmen expressed concerns about the difficulty of classes, rapport with teachers, and even going to college with older students.

One current RLC student said. "This is a place of study, and for future students to worry about their experience there is very common. But they shouldn't worry about the older students because we are all here for the same reason —

to further our education." And of course there is always the common worry over whether the classes will be difficult and if the teachers are helpful. Another current student mentioned, "A classes' difficulty all depends upon the student's level of understanding, how much they care about the subject, and also the teacher. The teacher plays a big role in the classes because of how he or she decides to present the information — either through slide shows, lecture, and homework. In my opinion, I feel that the best instructor uses all of the teaching methods, and as well seems to find a way to connect with the students in order to understand what they feel about the class."


