Dates set for first Concealed Carry certification classes at RLC

RLC PUBLIC INFORMATION un owners in Southern Illinois and throughout the state will soon have the option to choose

Rend Lake College as a training center to earn a concealed carry

On Monday, the Illinois State Police released a list of approved concealed carry firearm training curricula and training centers, including RLC, in connection with the Firearm Concealed Carry Act, which was passed on July 9, 2013. Three classes have been set in a two-day format to offer the certification.

The classes will be held in a two-day format. Two classes will be held from 8-4:30 p.m. at the RLC MarketPlace in Mt. Vernon: Saturday, Nov. 9 and Sunday, Nov. 10; and Saturday, Dec. 7 and Sunday, Dec. 8.

Additionally, one class scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 23 and

Sunday, Nov. 24 will last from 8-6 p.m. at the RLC MarketPlace for training in concealed carry laws in both Illinois and Utah.

The first day of the course will include classroom work and instruction by a RLC certified instructor, including a minimum of 8 hours of work and a half-hour lunch break. No firearms should be brought into the classroom or onto the RLC MarketPlace cam-

Day two instruction will begin at

the RLC MarketPlace and the class will travel to the Mt. Vernon Firing Range to complete certification. Instruction will be provided on the first day of the class regarding firearms for the Firing Range.

RLC is offering the classes at \$200 for each two-day session. Once the participant enrolls in the training class, they must also be fingerprinted at an additional cost of approximately \$75 and fill out an application for a state license, which costs \$150. Fingerprinting

applications before January 5, 2014; however, the training class can be completed beforehand.

To register for the class, contact the RLC Community and Corporate Education Division at (618) 437-5321, Ext. 1267. Registration and payment must be completed by the day before the class, and will be accepted until the class is full.

Rend Lake College Board of Trustees meeting highlights

NEW CERTIFICATES, COURSES APPROVED

The board approved two new certificates, several new courses and other changes to curriculum and authorized their submission to the Illinois Community College Board for action.

The two new certificates approved were:

Cyber Forensics Specialist — This certificate will prepare students to work in the criminal justice field dealing with cyber crime.

The certificate will include four new courses: Cyber Crime and Law, Computer Forensics I and II; and Cyber Crime and Investigation. Six existing courses also will be included in the certificate.

Health Care Coach — The certificate will prepare students to work in the medical field as a health coach. Students will work under the close mentorship of a group of multidisciplinary health profession-

Four new courses — Introduction to Health Care, plus the existing Introduc-

Health Care Psychology, Health Care Terminology and Community Health Care tion to Nutrition course will make up this certificate.

Other new courses approved Tuesday were

Concealed Carry Law and Qualification, Firearm Safety and Marksmanship, Computerized Accounting with QuickBooks, and Instructional Methods in Practice. The Concealed Carry and Firearm Safety classes are related to RLC's offering of concealed carry training, the first session of which will be the weekend of Nov. 9 and 10 at the RLC MarketPlace.

Computerized Accounting with QuickBooks is a course being added to three programs in the Office Systems Technology area: the Associate in Applied Science degrees in Administrative Assistant and Health Information Assistant, and the occupational certificate in Office Assistant.

2013 TAX LEVY ADOPTED

The board adopted the 2013 tax levy (payable 2014). The levy represents a slight decrease — 0.04 percent — over last year. The Corporate and Special Purpose levy went from \$3,143,098 last year to \$3,003,038 this year, a decrease of 4.46 percent. The Debt Service levy rose from \$1,682,679 last year to \$1,820,902 this year, an increase of 8.21 percent.




