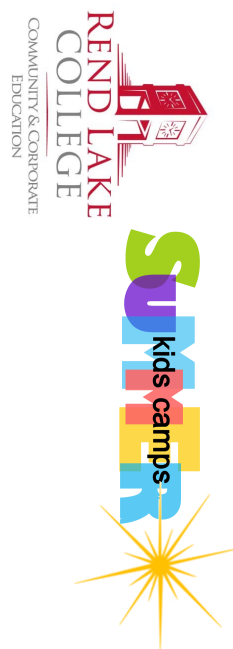
SUPERVISED LUNCH
