end Lake College softball wrapped up its spring break trip to Florida on March 15 with a shutout sweep of Carl Sandburg College, 3-0 and 5-0. The Lady Warriors finished 5-3 in the Sunshine State's University of West Florida Spring Fling in Pensacola.

It improved to 5-5 with the sweep on Friday - its fourth straight win. RLC lost two to Lincoln University (Mo.), 2-1 and 7-2, on Tuesday; split with Black Hawk College, 1-0 and 8-2, on Wednesday; and swept Southeastern Illinois College, 6-3 and 7-3, yesterday. The 1-0 win over Black Hawk was in walk-off fashion and was the highlight of the trip, according to Head Coach Dave Ellingsworth. Taylor Cheek (Pincknevville, III.) hit a twoout single to score Molly Whaley (Benton, III.) who had walked earlier in the

inning. Fellow Benton native Amanda Holloway threw the first shutout against Carl Sandburg today. Holloway threw all seven innings striking out three, walking three, and giving up five hits.

She finished 3-1 at the Spring Fling.

In the second game, it was Erica Wilson (O'Fallon, III.) getting the shutout win. She also went all seven innings. Wilson struck out one, walked three and gave up three hits.

Besides freshman Fallon Clayton (Anna, III.) at the lead-off spot, Ellingsworth has been experimenting with his lineup. Three players have hit cleanup so far — Breanne Pelker (Nashville, III.), Whaley and Taylor Thomas

(Arcola, III.). 'That's one thing good about this whole trip. Everybody contributed," said Ellingsworth.

Macklin, a freshman guard from Louisville, Ky., averaged a team-high 13.7 points per game and shot 67.5 percent from the freethrow line and 44.4 percent from the field. Macklin also led the team in three-pointers made per game, and averaged 3.5 rebounds, 1.7 assists and 1.2 steals per

Verhines, a sophomore forward from Woodlawn, III., led the Warriors in rebounds and blocks per game with 8.1 and 1.9, respectively. Verhines averaged 9.5 points per game, and shot 52.8 percent from the field and 60.3 percent from the free-throw line. His brother, Dawson Verhines, also plays for the Warriors.

## Region 24 Champs, Warriors dancing in Danville for second straight year

end Lake College men's basketball won the NJCAA DII Region XXIV Championship 86-78 over John Wood Community College and advances to the national championship tournament for the second straight year. The 28th Annual NJCAA DII Men's Basketball Tournament is March 19-23 at **Danville Area Community** College.

Rend Lake is the #4 seed in the tournament and will face #13 Cecil College (Md.) at 8:30 p.m., Tuesday, March 19. The Seahawks, with a regular season record of 14-14, edged the topranked DII team in the country, Community College of Beaver County, 96-95, to become one of two teams

advancing to nationals from Region XX.

RLC was the top seed in the region tournament. It beat Lincoln College 76-65 on Saturday to advance to the championship with John Wood, which had eliminated Danville Area – ranked #2 in the nation – 66-58.

Down by two at the half,

RLC scored 60 points in the second half with sophomore guard Dawson Verhines (Woodlawn, III.) going off from three-point range. He scored 15 of his team-high 26 in the second half.

The Warriors pulled away from a two-point lead in the final four minutes to advance to the NJCAA Division II national tournament for the second straight year.

Jon White's 3-pointer cut Rend Lake's lead to 71-69 with 4:05 left in the game but the Warriors responded with a 9-2 run, taking an 80-71 lead on Jeril Taylor's two free throws with 35.8 seconds left.

Of Rend Lake's final eight field goals in the game, seven were 3-pointers. For the game, the Warriors were 12 of 19 from behind the arc.

A 6-0 run early in the second half put Rend Lake ahead 36-30. But JWCC, the No. 3 seed, answered with a 9-2 spurt, taking a 39-38 lead on Brad Hamilton's 3-pointer from the right side with 14:44 left.

Rend Lake took the lead for good when Montez Buford scored to make the score 42-41 with 13:58 left. Stephon Bryant's two free throws with 10:50 left capped off a 10-0 Warriors run which stretched their lead to 50-41.

Hamilton led JWCC, which played in the title game for the first since 1996, with 17 points, while White came off the bench to score 15 and T.J. Tisdell added 12.

Dawson Verhines led Rend Lake with 26 points, 15 in the second half, while Taylor scored 17 of his 19 points after halftime.

Rend Lake has won 10 straight games and 18 of

Cecil College is listed as the best DII, three-point shooting team in the nation at 54.4 percent, according to stats on the NJCAA website at www.njcaa.org. The Seahawks are also reportedly third in the nation in overall shooting - also 54.4 percent. According to the NJCAA, they are led in scoring by 6-4 freshman guard Donte Adams at 21.8 points per game. Adams is a product of Eagle Academy in Bronx, N.Y. In the title game against Beaver County, Adams scored 34 points. Stedman Allen, a 6-5 freshman also from Eagle Academy, was named tournament MVP. He scored 14 points and pulled

down 10 rebounds. But it was 6-6 freshman Amadius Derweer (Virgin Islands) who hit the put-back with 16 seconds left to give the Seahawks the one-point win that Cecil Head Coach LeShawn Hammett called "one of the most exciting I've ever been a part of," according to the Cecil website at www.cecil.edu.

If RLC beats Cecil on Tuesday, it will play at 8 p.m., Wednesday, against the winner of #5 South Suburban (30-3, South Holland, III.) and #11 Phoenix College (20-12).
