To vote, a student will be required to present his ID card to one of the officials. The ID card will be stamped to indicate that the student has voted.

Voters should keep the following information in mind when marking their ballots: An "X" should be written in the box beside the name of the candidate for whom one is voting; The "X" should cross within the box. To vote a straight ticket—that is, vote for all the candidates of a party—make an "X" within the circle next to the name of the party at the top of that party's column. Non-Jefferson County residents will be given special ballots in the election. On their ballots a line will be drawn between the list of state and federal candidates and the Jefferson County candidates.
