From Rend Lake to River Radio: RLC graphic design grad loving the workforce

Only six years have passed since former Pinckneyville native Brittani Wynn tra-

versed the halls of Rend Lake College. But since then, she has gone miles.

The graphic design major at RLC graduated in 2007 with an Associate of Science degree

before moving on to both a bachelor's and a master's degree in professional media and media management at Southern Illinois University. Wynn said that it was her

experiences in RLC's graphic design program that helped start a successful career that has begun with designing material for a local ESPN network and the country band Florida Georgia Line.

"We had small class sizes at RLC, so we got to be a small family together for our two years. Two classmates of mine actually became my roommates later. I feel like that helped me a lot," said Wynn. "We all had to have the same credits to graduate, so we were in all of the same classes together. We learned off each other's styles and provided helpful criticism. We learned one another's strengths and weaknesses, and we were able to focus in on those a lot better."

Wynn added it was the college's proximity to her home and low costs that initially drew her in.

"It was the local college, and I knew I wanted to start small and go on to a university. It was a lot

cheaper and, at the time, a lot easier, because I didn't want to move out immediately. I wanted to stay close to my family and get a good education at the same time," she said.

Even after leaving RLC, Wynn said her instructor, Jennifer Taratino Linsin, continued to help in her career as an advocate and driving force.

"First of all, my teacher was extremely inspirational in getting me on the right track. She was always pushing us to explore our interests and believing in us. She has been immensely helpful in my career and she's been my inspiration," said Wynn.

In addition to her graphic design program, Wynn was also on RLC's Homecoming Court and was a member of the National Honor Society of Leadership and Success. Now living in Carterville and working for River Radio, Wynn said her education at RLC set the stage for

RLC looking for locals, students to attend to new Community Garden

Rend Lake College is searching for students and local residents who want to get their hands dirty at the new Community Garden, located on the Ina campus next to the Historic Schoolhouse. This new project started last year with preliminary plans, and is now expanding to accept anyone who wants to get more hands-on experience.

RLC Horticulture Instructor Ryne Fullerton said no prior classes or skills are necessary to take part, only time and enthusiasm. The summer class will begin April 21 and run through August 6. The deadline to register is April 14.

"We're inviting people

to take the Community Garden class, Horticulture 1219, as a vegetable production class where students can take home produce they grow," said Fullerton.

"Anyone with gardening experience is welcome, and even those who don't have any experience at all. It's an opportunity to come out and learn about different vegetables without sitting through a lecture. I've been gardening for 20 years or so, and I learn something every time I work in a garden."

Participants will grow many different kinds of produce, such as sweet corn, tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, cantaloupe and other mel-

her to learn even more on the job.

"Right now, I'm learning a lot. I'm freelance designing for a couple places and getting my foot in the door," she said. "I'm working between 50 and 55 hours a week at the two jobs."

In the recent past, Wynn has completed some unique projects, from designing a banner for a show called "Riding the Pine" for local ESPN station WXLt at the Southern Illinois Miner's Rent One Park to creating a certificate for a sound check party at HerrinFesta with the band members of Florida Georgia Line. She said the certificates were auctioned off last year, and were a part of an effort to raise more than \$258,000 for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

"I'm really a jack of all trades. I've done commer-

cials and graphic work here at River Radio. I've also made home décor that is being sold in Hobby Lobby and Kirkland's around the nation," said Wynn. "I co-hosted the sound check party for our Z100 station where I got to go and meet, and hang out, with Florida Georgia Line."

This year, Wynn again had the opportunity to design the Z100 St. Jude Radiothon T-shirts, and, with the help of the community, raised over \$270,000, surpassing the 2013 total. In the future, the former Warrior hopes to expand her knowledge of graphic design with the continued support of her family.

"I just want to see where my design takes me," she said. "I am also grateful and lucky to have had the support of my family, especially from my brothers, my dad and my mom, Daniell Weinhoffer, who has always encouraged me to be the best person I can be."

ons, pumpkins, gourds and squash. There will also be an herb garden featuring chives, basil, rosemary and sage. Fullerton added there might be other produce, depending on what the students want.

"The way it will work is students will meet once in a classroom for the introduction and a schedule will be handed out," said Fullerton. "It won't be the typical class where you have to come Monday and Wednesday for two hours. It's set up so that the student can come whenever they have time, as long as they have 4 hours every week for a total of 64 hours by the end of the class."

The class is two credit hours and can be used as

an elective for many different programs at RLC, not just horticulture. Students will receive a pass/fail grade at the end of the course.

Fullerton said there is already a bit of interest in the course and several individuals are already signed up. If the class continues to gain popularity, he said there might be options next year to work in other areas of RLC's district.

"Different communities will donate a lot or area of land for community gardens, but for right now, we have an acre and a half available to use on the Ina campus," he said. "We're starting on the low end, but if we get more people interested, we can grow it."

RLC finished 14th as a JUCO among many NCAA teams. The Lady Warriors finished with an overall score of 693 (351-342).

Burgett tied for 57th place with a score of 170 (89-81). She was followed by sophomore Kylee Henager

(Mt. Carmel) in 63rd place at 173 (85-88). Rounding up the team players was Ashley Sexton (Anderson, Ind.) in 67th at 175 (88-87), Katie Garver (Campbell Hill) in 74th at 177 (91-86), and Emily Thomas (Moline) in 88th with 186 (89-97). Freshman Kaylyn Fuhrhop (Okawville) competed as an individual, finishing 85th with a score of 184 (96-88).

Head Coach Cindy Corn said she is proud of the team for competing against tougher division schools, and is looking forward to Nationals next month.

"The girls played pretty well this weekend," she said. "We have such a young team this year and because of that, they still get a little nervous when they get to the course. Madison has started figuring it all

out, and we're improving. We could register and play in tournaments we would win, but that's not pushing the team to do better. We've got Nationals coming up in a few weeks, so we're working to get there. Because they're almost all freshman, we've got nothing to lose."

William Woods University of Fulton, Mo. came in first place this weekend at 605 (306-299), followed by invite host Washington University of St. Louis at 606 (300-306). There were only three other Illinois schools competing: Illinois Wesleyan of Bloomington who placed 9th overall with a score of 605 (329-321), North Central College of Naperville who placed 13th overall at 686 (347-339), and Millikin University who placed 16th overall with a score of 724

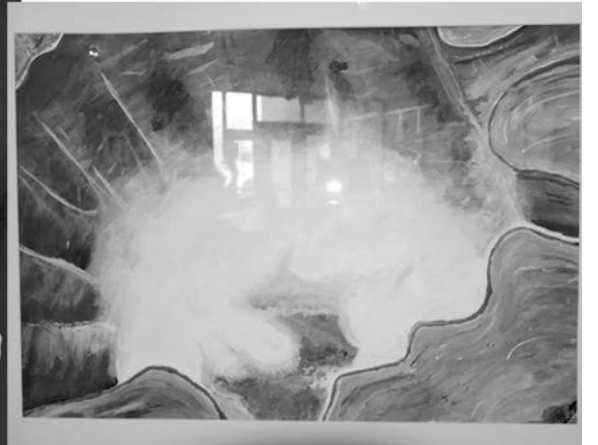
