Warrior Day, Super Saturday scheduled for Spring 2015

Worksite Wellness Committee accepts Gold recognition

Last week at the State Capitol, Rend Lake College's Worksite Wellness Committee and a handful of other organizations were honored with an Illinois Healthy Worksite Designation by the Illinois Department of Public Health. RLC received Gold recognition, the highest honor, thanks to the "We Choose Health" grant, funded by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The Illinois Healthy Worksite Designation was created in 2014 to recognize workplaces with healthy practices that benefit employees and employers alike. The Worksite Wellness Committee was formed at RLC to improve the health and

happiness of employees by helping them reach wellness goals through motivation, encouragement, and informational activities. Some of the activities include Lunch-N-Learn, Walk-N-Talk, monthly challenges, ongoing newsletters, and much more. RLC is one of only five organizations to receive recognition in Southern Illinois. There were 11 other organizations who received Gold, 14 received Silver, and 16 received Bronze.

The Illinois Healthy Worksite Designation was created as part of the statewide "We Choose Health" community transformation grant, which was funded by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and

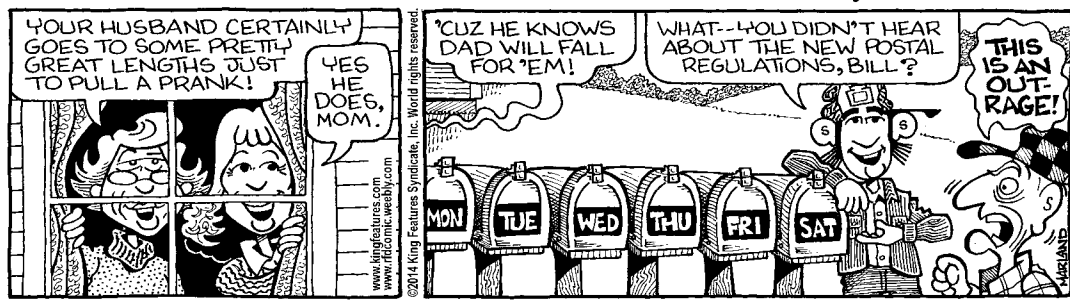

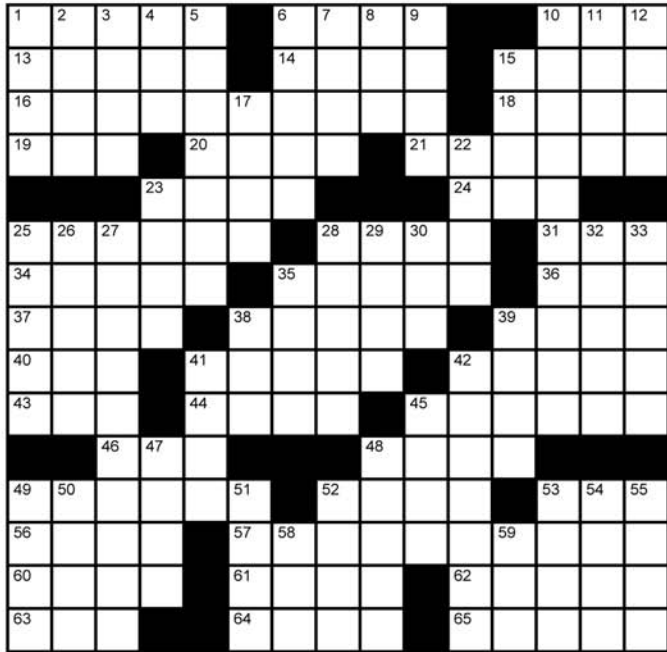

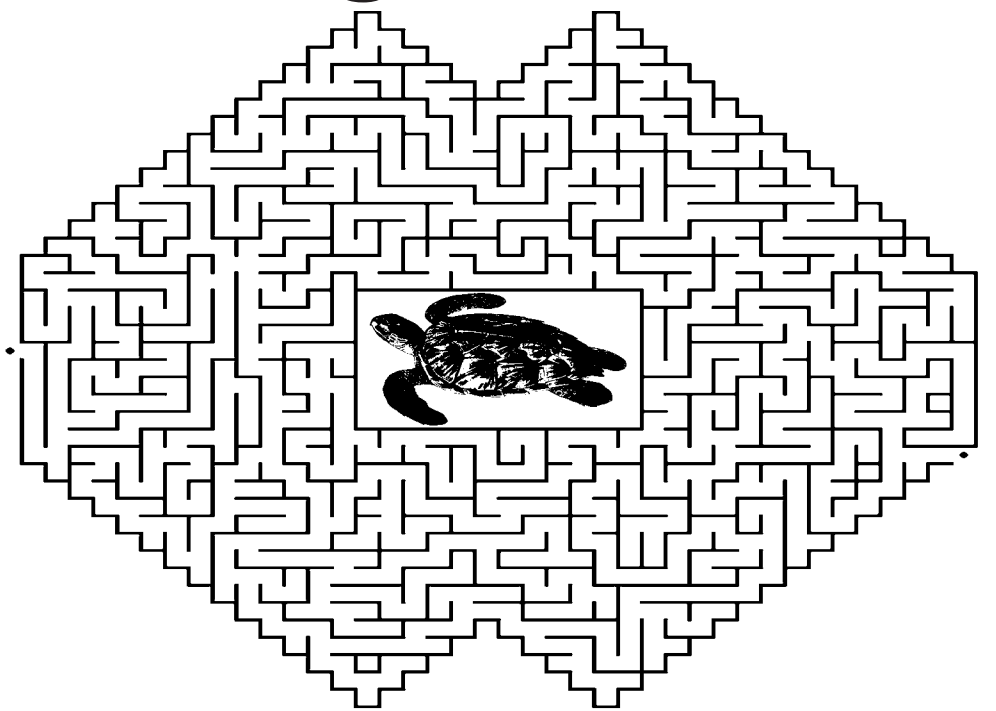

Caldwell visits Waltonville High School students, talks about college life

Cindy Caldwell, Rend Lake College Mathematics associate professor, visited with 11 Waltonville High School students last week to give them one-on-one time to ask questions about college. Caldwell teaches the dual credit College Algebra course for Waltonville through distance-learning, and spoke about the differences between a typical College Algebra class at a four-year university and at RLC.

some very interesting and important questions about college," said Caldwell. "I really had a good time and I think the students appreciated the visit. I think it's important that RLC is trying to work with area schools to provide dual credit courses. Schools are tight on money, so with distance-learning, I hope we can help area high schools with dual credit courses."

The dual credit program at RLC offers tuition-free courses with a reduced rate for textbook rental for in-district high school students. High School juniors and seniors take these

classes during the day at their school, helping meet graduation requirements at both the high school and RLC. All 13 public high schools in RLC's district are registered with the program, of which 12 participated last year. The courses are taught by both college and high school instructors. Last year, a total of 1,581 students enrolled in dual credit courses at RLC, saving \$792,110 in tuition.

Leading the scoring column for the Warriors was freshman Perry Fairrow (Evansville, Ind.) with 14 points and freshman Detric Byrd (Champaign) with 13 points respectively. Fairrow also added three rebounds, one assist, and two steals during the game. Byrd had three rebounds, one assist, and five steals.

Kourtrandt Martin

(Evansville, Ind.) also logged 10 points for the evening, in addition to two assists and five steals. He was followed in scoring by Eric Williams (Memphis, Tenn.) with eight points, two steals, and one block. Other top performers were Armani Towns (Columbus, Ohio) with six points, seven rebounds, and two assists; Robert Sawyer (Louisville, Ky.) with two points and five rebounds; Derek McKeithen (Columbus, Ohio) with four rebounds; Richard Clemons (Louisville, Ky.) with one rebound; Ryan Otis (Houston, Texas) with two rebounds; and Clint Johannes (Ashley) with one assist.

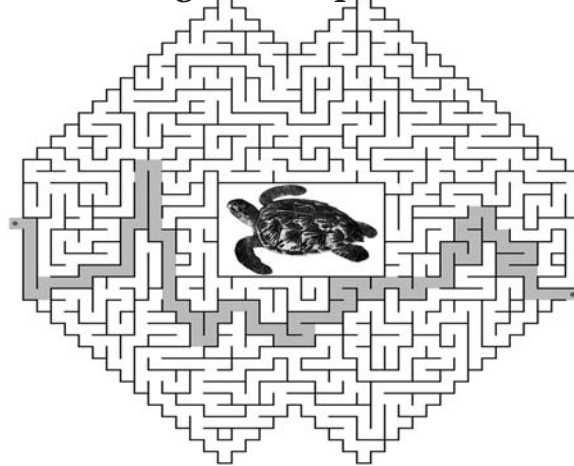
