Students should arrive on campus no later than one hour before campus closing to ensure ample time to complete the registration and financial aid processes. Payment is due at the time of enrollment, so students should come prepared. Those who do not have financial aid will need to self-pay that day or sign up for the FACTS Payment Plan in the Business Office to ensure they remain enrolled. To complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), visit www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Testing open for SICCM, Nursing, Rad Tech programs

Deadlines to apply to a number of health-care programs at Rend Lake College are fast approaching, so register now for testing into the Nursing, Radiologic Technology, and SICCM (Southern Illinois Collegiate Common Market) programs.

The SICCM programs RLC offers include Medical Laboratory Technician, Surgical Technology, Occupational Therapy, and Veterinary Technician. The deadline to apply for entry into these programs is March 1, but students are required to complete the Psychological Service Bureau (PSB) test beforehand through RLC's testing center, located in the Academic Advisement Center in the Administration Building.

Students interested in the Nursing or Radiologic Technology programs are also required to complete the PSB test, though program entry deadlines are not until April 1.

The employment and job

outlook for all of these programs continues to grow across the country, most adding jobs at a faster-than-average speed. For nurses, an expected 526,800 jobs will be created in the next eight years. There will be another 48,600 for radiologic technicians; 70,600 for medical lab technicians; 29,300 for surgical technicians; 32,800 for occupational therapists; and 25,000 for veterinary technicians, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

"Careers in the health-care industry have been on a continuous incline for the past few years, and that trend is holding true in our area and throughout the state," said Kim Robert, dean of Allied Health. "For anyone who wants to be a part of that growth, or for anyone who is looking for a change, these programs are a great way to get started, and these tests are the first step. Come in today to start the registration

First CNA classes of 2015 starting soon, register today

The first sections of Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) classes start this month at three Rend Lake College locations. With courses beginning every eight weeks, it's time to jump into the exciting and fast-paced realm of health care.

There will be one CNA class on the main campus in Ina, and it will meet from 4 - 8:15 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays starting Jan. 13 in the Learning Resource Center, Room 205. Another section of the class will meet from 5 - 9:15 p.m. on the same nights at the Murphy-Wall Pinckneyville Campus, Room 113.

Two more sections will be held at the RLC MarketPlace in Mt. Vernon. The first goes from 8:30 a.m. - 3 p.m. Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, that started on Jan. 6, in Room 241. A second class will meet a week later, lasting from 8:30 a.m. - 3 p.m. Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, starting Jan. 12, in Room 211.

CNA classes at RLC are tuition-free to in-district residents and now is the time to

start the registration process. Before enrolling in the CNA program, students must take a reading placement test and submit to a background check as mandated by the Illinois Department of Public Health. In addition, students must be at least 16 years of age before completion of the course.

The program is designed to teach students how to provide a number of healthcare needs to patients in a variety of settings, including hospitals, long term care facilities, and nursing homes. CNAs work under the supervision of a registered nurse or other nursing professionals. Upon completion of the RLC program, students will be eligible to apply for the state CNA registry examination. For those who want to develop their skills even farther, the eight-week CNA program also acts as a prerequisite for RLC's Nursing program.

There are currently 1.5 million positions for CNA and nursing aides across the country, with an additional 300,000 job creations by 2022, according to the U.S.

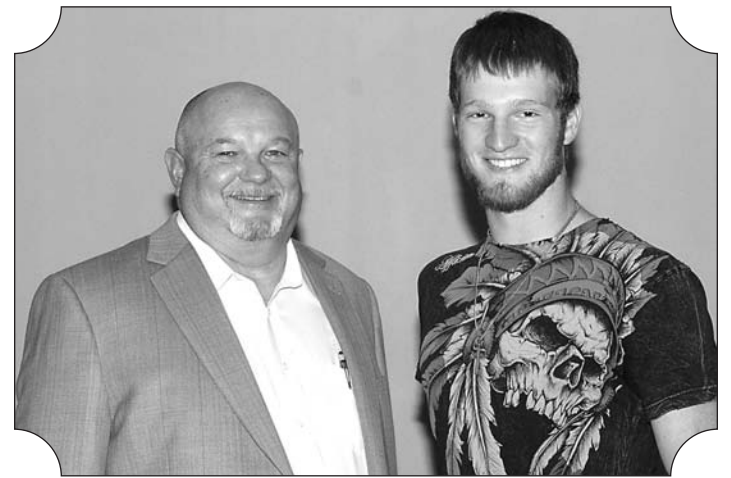

Train the Trainer CNA Instructor Course for RNs starting Jan. 12

Nurses looking to share their knowledge with others need search no further than the Rend Lake College "Train the Trainer" Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) Instructor course. The deadline to register was Wednesday, Jan. 7, and the course starts Monday, Jan. 12.

This hybrid course will feature online instruction with one face-to-face skills workshop on Monday, Feb. 23. Students will spend time completing readings, discussion postings, and assignments for

the Train the Trainer and Alzheimer's disease portions of the class from Jan. 12 through Feb. 13.

The skills workshop will require students to successfully return demonstrations of selected skills. During this time, participants must meet the qualifications outlined in the June 2013 Illinois Administrative Code Section 395.160 Instructor Requirements. Those requirements can be found online at www.ilga.gov. The workshop is scheduled for 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Feb. 23, at

the Nurse Training Center at the RLC MarketPlace in Mt. Vernon.

This course is designed to provide nurses the knowledge and skills to become a CNA Instructor in Illinois. The program will prepare qualified registered nurses to develop and effectively teach basic CNA programs. It is being conducted in compliance with Illinois Department of Public Health regulations.

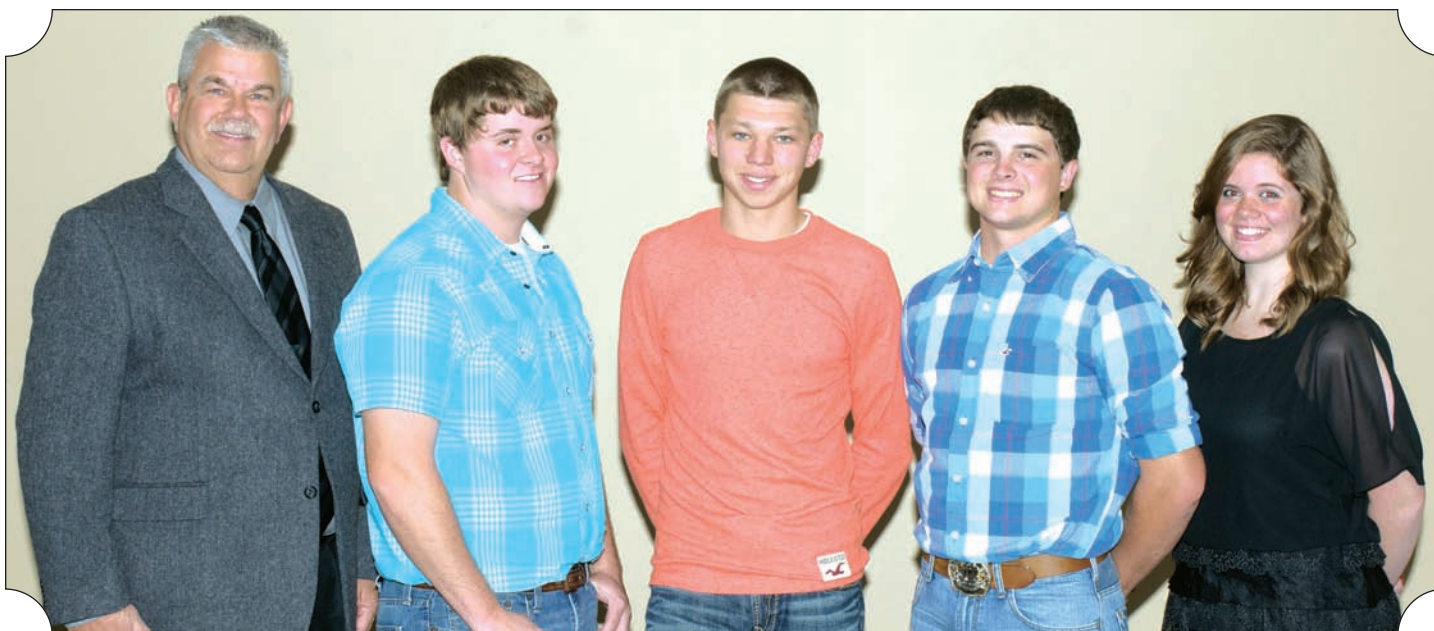

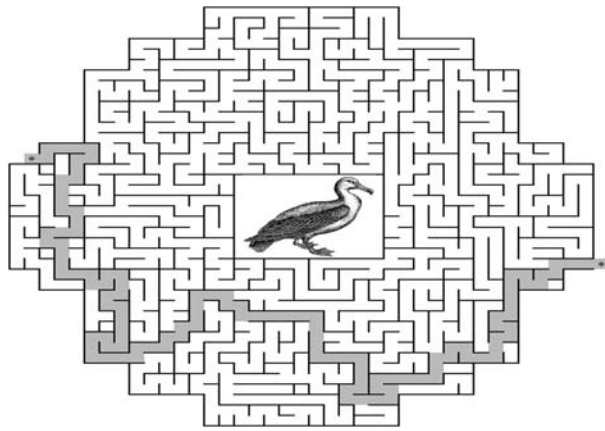
